




What is EUSBSR and what is PACINNO?

- The EU Strategy for the Baltic Sea Region is the first Macroregional Strategy in Europe (2009);
- It's an agreement between the Member States of the EU and the European Commission to strengthen cooperation between the countries bordering the Baltic Sea;
- The aim is to meet the **common challenges** and to benefit from **common opportunities** facing the region;
- 8 countries: Sweden, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Germany, Latvia, Lithuania and Poland. The Strategy is also welcoming cooperation with EU neighbouring countries (Russia, Iceland, Norway and Belarus).
- Implemented in concrete joint projects and processes.

Summary of the current coordination project PACINNO (2016-2018):

- Unified approach to the effective usage of innovation policy in the Baltic Sea Region
- Combination of digital single market, research and innovation and cluster/SMEs development
- Working to enhance innovation by
 - ensuring policy learning,
 - strenghtening and creating new networks,
 - aligning resources and regulations but also the possibilities to join forces in common programmes and investments.



Digitalisation: PAC Estonia

- Responsible for flagship initiative: currently two projects
 - Internet of Business (IoB) and
 - Digital Innovation Network DIGINNO
- Greenfield activities: e.g. Real-Time Economy.
 - Round Table to start with new topic: 1-2 Feb 2018
 - Possible seminar at the 9th Annual Forum of EUSBSR: 4-5 June
 2018 to promote RTE
 - New videoclip about RTE
 - Possible meetings (e.g. For smaller groups to identify problems and possibilities), other events, or Round Table-2, any other ideas during group work session – to initiate new collaborations, new projects, to make jointly RTE happen.

PRIORITY: DIGITALISATION

PACINNO for RTE:

- ✓ Bringing different actors (including policy makers) together, to identify common challenges and find solutions, to learn from each other.
- ✓ Organising events (meetings, round tables, seminars),
 By financing costs (room rent +catering
 (in some cases travel costs)
- ✓ Promoting RTE (e.g several videoclips)
